The Environmental Stewardship Workshop will provide teachers the opportunity to explore the various “Green” features of the The Children’s Museum of Pittsburgh. Many of the principles that will be covered in the workshop are demonstrated at the facility, which serves as a model of sustainable environmental practices. CMP one of the largest LEED certified museums in the country, and demonstrates a variety of sustainable design principles throughout its facility. The museum uses 100% renewable energy for its electricity and has a PV array to power lights in its café. A water exhibit highlights water conservation issues, while low-flow fixtures are utilized throughout the museum’s restrooms, and no-irrigation landscaping is featured in their backyard exhibit. Recently, through PA DEP grant funding, PRC designed and installed a worm composting system at the museum to recycle the café’s food waste.

Participants will have the advantage of observing real life applications of environmental topics covered in the workshop. Teachers will receive one Act 48 credit upon completion of a required project (a unit plan and/or audio/visual materials that integrates material presented during the workshop and addresses relevant PA Academic Standards) or may choose not to do a project and instead be awarded 15 hrs.
